A NOTE FROM OUR ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Welcome to LOST GIRL -

There are some stories we come back to because they still have something to say to us. Lost Girl has always been that kind of story for me. It's gentle, it's honest, and it hits in places I didn't expect until I started working on it again.

When I first read this play, I connected with Wendy right away. Not because of her search for Peter, but because of that feeling of standing between who you used to be and who you hope you're becoming. That feeling of trying to take back pieces of yourself you thought were gone. That feeling of growing up faster than you ever wanted to.

Working on this show made me remember a lot of moments in my own life that shaped me. Not the dramatic ones, but the quiet ones. The ones that left marks, the ones that taught me how to hold on, and the ones that pushed me forward even when I didn't feel ready. Theatre has always been the place I return to when I'm trying to understand myself, and this story gave me a new kind of peace and a new kind of courage. It reminded me that healing doesn't happen all at once. Sometimes it's just choosing to keep going, one small moment at a time.

I cannot say enough about this cast and this team. These young artists showed up with so much heart and honesty. They stepped into a story about loss, growth, and bravery and made it feel alive, real, and full of hope. Every one of them brought something special, and I am incredibly proud of the work they've done.

Thank you for being here. Thank you for supporting Rebel Phoenix Theatre Collective and for supporting new plays and young artists. I hope this story finds you in whatever chapter you're in right now. And I hope you leave with a little softness for who you were, a little strength for who you're becoming, and the reminder that healing is possible even when it doesn't feel straightforward.




